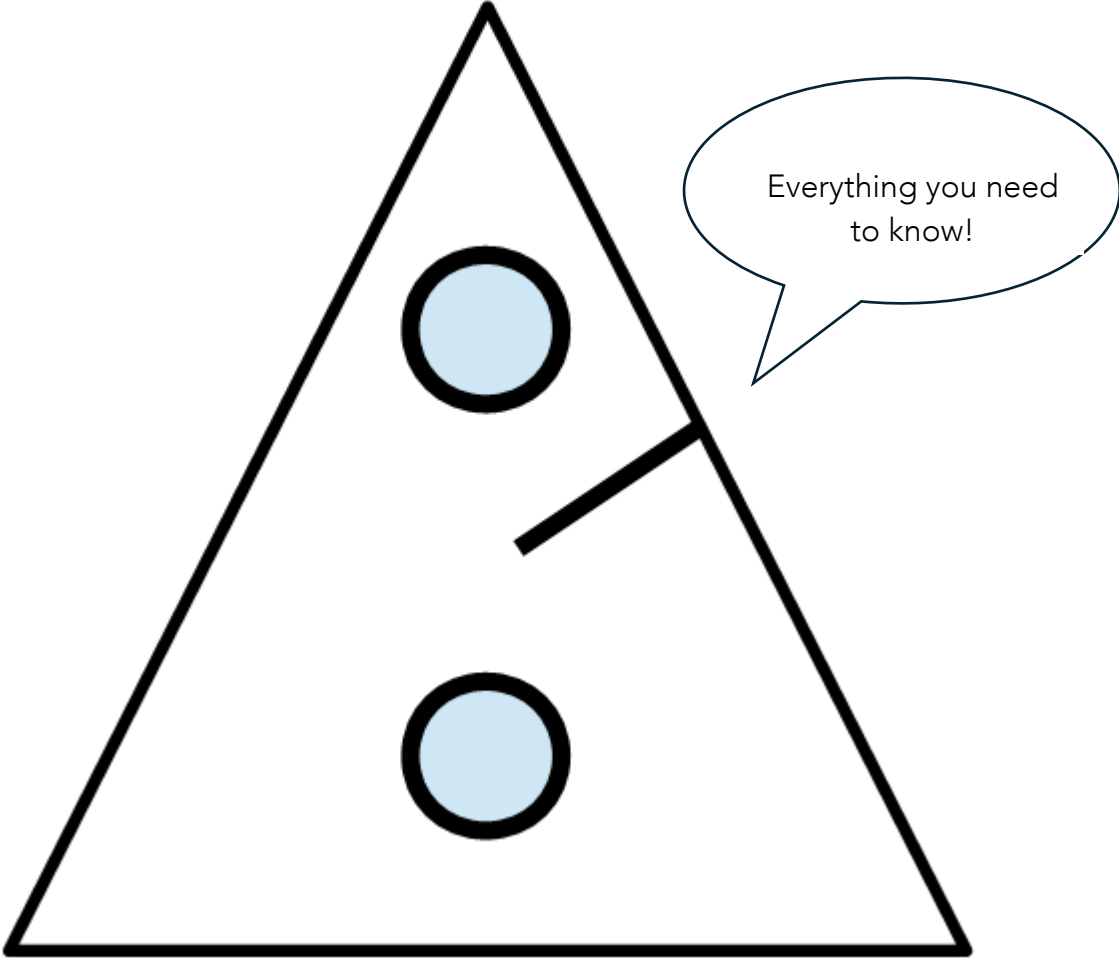

# On-campus housing information

---

## *Overview*

The 2024 ICEBERG Institute will be conducted at the University of Central Florida in beautiful Orlando, FL. Participants staying on campus will be housed in the **Lake Claire Apartments (12580 Gemini Blvd N, Orlando, FL 32816)**. Each participant will have an individual bedroom, with each four bedrooms adjoining a shared kitchen and living area. All residential spaces are air-conditioned. The following will be provided for each participant: (1) pillow, (1) pillowcase, (1) twin XL fitted sheet, (1) flat sheet, (1) blanket, (2) bath towels, (2) hand towels, (2) washcloths, (1) disposable bathmat, (2) plastic cups, and (1) bar of soap.

## *Checking In*

Participants may check in on June 2, 2024 **anytime after 8:00 AM**.

Participants will arrive to the Lake Claire Community Office (12580 Gemini Blvd N, Orlando, FL 32816) on check-in day at their leisure. If no one is physically in the office, call the 24/7 office line posted on the office door (407-885-2138) and a Housing staff member will meet you there to distribute keys. The office is open 24/7, even if no one is physically present inside. The Lake Claire Community Office is also the point of contact for participants during their stay should they have any maintenance issues, lockouts, emergencies, questions, etc.

## *Checking Out*

Participants must check out on June 15, 2024 **before 2:00 PM**.

Housing staff will be on call for the Lake Claire Community Office to collect keys as participants leave on checkout day. Any lost or damaged keys will incur a \$50.00 replacement fee for key cards, or a \$75.00 fee for hard bedroom keys (hard keys only provided upon request).

# Transportation

---

The University of Central Florida campus is walkable. There are numerous restaurants, bars, and stores (both on and off-campus) within walking distance. However, if you need to leave the immediate campus vicinity, you will need to utilize another form of transportation.

## *Travel by Car*

Orlando is a sprawling city, and traveling by car is generally the most efficient way to get from place to place. Participants are welcome to bring a car to the Institute (though they will have to pay for parking – see next page). Uber, Lyft, and other ride-sharing services are also available. Participants are encouraged to carpool whenever possible.

## *Travel by Bus*

Orlando has a robust bus system, known by the acronym LYNX (<https://www.golynx.com>). However, because the city is so spread out, the convenience of traveling by bus depends on one's destination. UCF is a hub for the Nos. 13, 104, and 434 buses. A route map is available here:

Bus fare is \$2.00 USD for a single ride, or \$4.50 USD for an all-day pass. If you are in the downtown area, then special LYMMO buses (which only operate downtown) are free to ride.

## *Travel by Bike and Scooter*

Bikes, E-bikes, and electric scooters are all available to rent at UCF using various apps. You will see them parked in designated areas all over campus. These vehicles cannot travel beyond the campus boundaries but are good options for longer on-campus journeys.

# Parking

---

The best place to park for ICEBERG Institute is in either the lot in front of the UCF Performing Arts Center (12488 Centaurus Blvd. Orlando, FL 32816) or in Parking Garage I, immediately adjacent.

Parking is not free. Those parking a vehicle will need to purchase a virtual daily pass for each day their vehicle is on campus. This can be done in advance: to purchase a virtual daily pass, visit this link:

# Navigating UCF's campus

UCF's main campus is very large. All ICEBERG Institute activities will take place just in the Northwest quadrant of the campus. The important locations to know are:

- Rehearsal Hall
- Performing Arts Center (Music Building)
- Parking Garage I
- Lake Claire Apartments

From there, travel a little further West and you'll see the performing Arts Center and Parking Garage I. The Lake Claire Apartments are just slightly further North.

Don't worry! After a day or two, navigating this area will become very straightforward.
